

Forsyth County 4-H Nutrition Fair

Forsyth County 4-H will be hosting a Nutrition Fair on **Tuesday, March 4th** at the Cooperative Extension Office. Set-up will be at 5:30, with the actual contest starting at 6pm.

“What is a Nutrition Fair?”, you may ask. A Nutrition Fair is a 4-H exhibit where youth ages 5-18 will prepare a nutritious dish at home, as well as a table setting that goes along with their dish and presents it to one or two adult judges. Youth must also include their recipe on a recipe card. Exhibits are judged on dish preparation, healthiness, taste of the dish, and your overall attire.

“What are the prizes?” As prizes, participants will receive ribbons, scholarship dollars, communication skills, plus they will get to spend time with their friends while learning some new recipes!

“What are the categories?” The categories that may be entered are Breads, Main Dishes, Beverages, Fruits and Vegetables, Desserts, and Snacks. In each of these categories, ages are split as follows: 5-8, 9-12, and 13-18.

“What is an example?” A good example of what will be being judged would be: your dish might be campfire cookies. To make them nutritious, you substitute applesauce for cooking oil. For your table setting, you use a red and white gingham tablecloth, a tin plate and a mug. You wear a western shirt and jeans, with a red bandana at the neck.

“When are entries due?” Entries must be **received by February 19th**, so that a recipe booklet can be made of all entries. For more information, please contact the 4-H office at 336-703-2850, or visit us online at www.forsyth.cc/CES.
