COUNTY MANAGER'S RECOMMENDATION OR COMMENTS:

#### SUMMARY OF INFORMATION:

The purpose of this agenda item is to close-out the 2012 and 2013 Pay-Go Capital Projects Ordinances and transfer any outstanding projects and residual funds from completed projects resulting in savings once bid therein to establish the 2015 Pay-Go Capital Projects Ordinance. In addition, the 2015-2016 Budget Ordinance will be amended to appropriate fund balance into the General Fund for additional projects to be authorized by the Board of Commissioners. Lastly, the 2011 Library Bonds Capital Projects Ordinance is amended to accept a transfer of General Fund fund balance for the purpose of avoiding the issuance of the remaining bonds.

The year-end Financial Audit results as well as the fund balance policy change from 16% to 14% resulted in \$16,070,954 available for debt avoidance, positive return on investment, and capital projects. The Board has already approved using \$7,080,500 of this funding for economic development projects as well as the establishment of the Library Debt Leveling Plan. This reduces the amount of Pay-Go funding to \$8,990,454.

The 2012 and 2013 Pay-Go CPOs will be closed out and two incomplete projects will move forward, along with the project savings and other revenue, to the 2015 Pay-Go CPO. The projects being moved from the 2012 and 2013 Pay-Go Capital Project Ordinances have been approved by the Board and are either in-progress or are being reviewed.

In order to fund the projects in this agenda item, it is recommended to use \$868,745 from the repayment of the CenterPoint loan and \$29,877.76 of Capital Maintenance reserve funding to fund projects listed below.

The FY 2015-2016 Budget Ordinance, Section 12, outlined several projects for possible Pay-Go funding. Because of new priorities, some of those projects will not be funded with this round of Pay-Go dollars. Each project, unless already authorized to proceed, will be brought back before the Board prior to moving forward.

In order to fund these projects, it is recommended to use \$868,745 from the repayment of the CenterPoint loan and \$29,877.76 of Capital Maintenance reserve funding to fund projects listed below.

The 2015-2016 Budget Ordinance included \$8,000,000 for Economic Development Reserves, however, Board approved projects for Economic Development total \$11,500,000, \$3.5 million more than allowed for in the ordinance.

#### 2011 Library Bonds Capital Projects Ordinance

In 2010, voters approved a \$40 million bond issuance for the renovation or replacement of the Central Library, Kernersville Branch Library, and Clemmons Branch Library. To date, \$34 million of General Obligation bonds have been issued and in an effort to reduce the amount of debt issuance for the libraries, the Board has followed a strategy of using bond premium and potential Pay-Go funding to make up the difference of \$6 million. The \$1,611,451 is half of what is necessary to make up the final portion. The remaining \$1,611,451 would be a priority in terms of potential Pay-Go projects in FY 2017.

#### 2015 Pay-Go Capital Projects Ordinance

The 2015 Pay-Go CPO will include old projects being rolled forward plus several projects from the 2015-2016 Budget Ordinance and new projects that take precedence over some of the projects outlined in Section 12 of the Budget Ordinance.

Overages in the estimated cost of the Probation & Parole project require funds initially set aside for projects to be shifted. Therefore, eliminations and/or reductions to projects outlined in Section 12 of the Budget Ordinance were necessary.

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#### **EXPLANATION:**

The purpose of this agenda item is to amend the 2011 Library Bond Capital Projects Ordinance to appropriate General Fund balance from the Fiscal Year 2015 close of year-end. The year-end Financial Audit results as well as the fund balance policy change from 16% to 14% has resulted in \$16,070,954 available for debt avoidance, positive return on investment, and capital projects.

In order to avoid issuing the full \$40 million of voter approved bonds from the November 2010 referedum, a decision was made to appropriate savings from the closure of the Central Library to the 2011 Library Bond Capital Projects Ordinance as well as other savings that have occured through the acquisition of bond premium. This will allow the County to only issue \$34,000,000 in bonds for Library projects.
