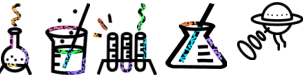
J Baldacci Day of Doom by David Baldacci

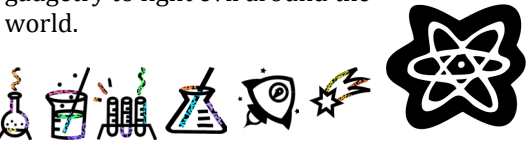
J Bauer Almost Home by Joan Bauer
