- 3-501.15 Cooling Methods PF Large plastic container (5 gallons) of chicken broth in walk-in cooler was 44F; all other foods temped in this cooler were 40F and below. Chile rellenos in base of prep cooler were in a tightly covered metal pan with condensation present on inside of lid; they were 43F and other foods in this cooler were 40F and below. Cooling shall be accomplished in accordance with the time and temp criteria by: placing the food in shallow pans; separating the food into smaller or thinner portions; using rapid cooling equipment; stirring the food in a container placed in an ice water bath; using containers that facilitate heat transfer; adding ice as an ingredient; or other effective methods. CDI foods were voluntarily discarded, discussion about cooling methods.
- 33 3-501.13 Thawing C Fish in ROP packaging in refrigerated drawer Packaging should be cut open to introduce oxygen during the thawing process; this is also printed on the packaging of the fish. This is a requirement in later versions of Food Code, but NC still uses 2009 version. Because of this, points cannot be deducted, but this is a food safety concern. REPEAT.
- 42 4-901.11 Equipment and Utensils, Air-Drying Required C Standing water in reassembled metal blender on shelf above prep sink. Square plastic containers nested together were still wet. Clean equipment and utensils shall be stored in a self-draining position that allows air drying. REPEAT.
- 4-501.12 Cutting Surfaces C Cutting board on prep cooler has deep cuts and is no longer easily cleanable. Surfaces such as cutting blocks and boards that are subject to scratching and scoring shall be resurfaced if they can no longer be effectively cleaned and sanitized, or discarded if they are not capable of being resurfaced.
- 4-602.13 Nonfood Contact Surfaces C Clean back corners of prep cooler under lid; some buildup present today. Non-food contact surfaces of equipment shall be cleaned at a frequency necessary to preclude accumulation of soil residues. Overall, cleaning of establishment looks good.
- 6-501.11 Repairing-Premises, Structures, Attachments, and Fixtures-Methods C Repair cracks in base of can wash REPEAT. Baseboards missing in kitchen; re-caulking is needed behind pre spray at dish machine and behind clean drainboard of 3 comp sink. Replace missing panel above walk-in cooler. Per manager, these repairs have been scheduled, and should be completed by January. Physical facilities shall be maintained in good repair.
