#### KNOW YOUR STATUS!

AIDS is not a death sentence but you must first know your status. Take charge of your health and **get tested!** 

### WHAT IS HIV?

- Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) is the virus which causes AIDS
- HIV is a virus that attacks and weakens the immune system
  - Only 4 body fluids transmit

HIV: 1. blood

- 2. semen
- 3. vaginal fluid
- 4. breast milk
- HIV is not curable but it is treatable! People can live a long, healthy life with HIV
- Unprotected sex and sharing needles are the two primary methods of HIV transmission in the US

# WHO IS MOST AFFECTED?

- Anyone who is sexually active
- Women
- Racial/ethnic minorities
- Men who have sex with men

- It's free and confidential at the local health department or through POSSE
- The CDC recommends everyone should at least once in their life be tested
- It's a simple, smart way to take control of your health
- It can affect your entire life and your family's lives
- Living a safe, healthy life is better than living one with HIV
- It's good to know if you are HIV+ so you can know how to stay healthy
