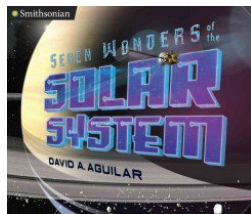

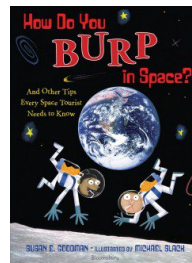


Seven Wonders of the Solar System

celestial orbs, from Mars to the mysterious Planet Nine. J523.2 A

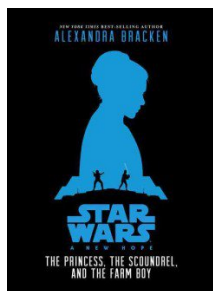


How Do You Burp in Space?

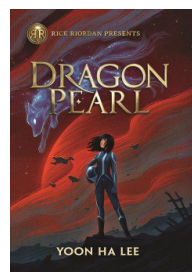

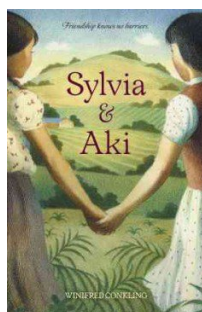
An illustrated, middle-grade retelling of Star Wars Episode IV incorporates new perspectives and unexpected twists into the classic tale of good versus evil.

by Yoon Ha Lee

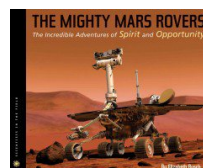
