



HISTORY OF FORSYTH COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE

IN 1849 A NEW COUNTY WAS FORMED FROM PART OF STOKES. THE NORTH CAROLINA GENERAL ASSEMBLY HONORED BENJAMIN FORSYTHE BY NAMING THE NEW COUNTY FOR HIM. SALEM, NOT WANTING TO BECOME THE COUNTY SEAT, YET WANTING IT NEAR BY, SOLD 52 1/4 ACRES TO THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS FOR THE SUM OF \$256.25. THE TOWN WAS LAID OUT IN SEVENTY-ONE LOTS WITH THE FIRST BEING SOLD TO ROBERT GRAY. WILLIAM BARROW BECAME THE FIRST MAYOR AND HEZEKIAH THOMAS WAS THE FIRST POLICE OFFICER. THE FORSYTH COUNTY JAIL IS THE RESPONSIBILITY OF THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE. IN 1953, FORSYTH COUNTY BUILT A NEW JAIL ON CHURCH ST. BEHIND CITY HALL AT A COST OF ABOUT \$400,000 TO REPLACE A STRUCTURE BUILT IN 1908. IN



1967, AN ADDITION CAPABLE OF HOUSING 72 PRISONERS WAS ADDED BRINGING THE CAPACITY TO 202 PRISONERS, AND THE COUNTY ASSUMED CUSTODY OF ALL PRISONERS INCLUDING THOSE FOR THE CITY OF WINSTON-SALEM. GROUND WAS BROKEN ON NOVEMBER 14, 1991 TO BEGIN CONSTRUCTION ON FORSYTH COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE LAW ENFORCEMENT DETENTION CENTER AT 201 N. CHURCH STREET. THE CONSTRUCTION WAS COMPLETED AND INMATES WERE HOUSED IN 1995. IT IS AN ADULT MAXIMUM SECURITY, 400,000 SQUARE FEET FACILITY HOUSING MALE AND FEMALE SENTENCED MISDEMEANANT AND PRE-TRIAL INMATES. THE FACILITY IS AN ELEVEN STORY TWIN TOWER STRUCTURE CONTAINING 735 MODULAR STEEL CELLS AND HAS A BED CAPACITY OF 1,016 INMATES. THE FORSYTH COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE MOVED FROM THE COURTHOUSE TO THE FORMER WINSTON-SALEM SAVINGS AND LOAN BUILDING AT 120 W. THIRD STREET IN 1995.

THE FORSYTH COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE WAS ESTABLISHED IN 1849 WITH ISSAC CHURCH APPOINTED SHERIFF BY THE GOVERNOR TO SERVE UNTIL THE 1850 ELECTION. WILL FLYNT WAS THE 1ST ELECTED SHERIFF SERVING FROM 1850-1854. HE WAS A PROMINENT AUCTIONEER. FROM 1854 TO 1874, MATHIS MASTEN SERVED AS SHERIFF. HE WAS A STRONG UNION SYMPATHIZER AND OPPOSED TO THE SOUTH'S SUCCESSION. JOHN GIDEON HILL SERVED FROM 1874 TO 1878. SHERIFF HILL WAS THE SHERIFF OF STOKES COUNTY BEFORE TAKING OFFICE IN FORSYTH COUNTY. AUGUSTUS FOGLE, A WELL KNOWN CABINET MAKER THAT REPUTEDLY CONSTRUCTED HIS OWN COFFIN, WAS ELECTED IN 1878 AND SERVED TO 1884. JOHN BOYER SERVED AS SHERIFF FROM 1884-1888. HE OPERATED A GOVERNMENT DISTILLERY ON BOYER BRIDGE RD WHICH IS NOW PEACE HAVEN RD. SERVING FROM 1888-1892 WAS M. E. TEAGUE, WHO SERVED AS WINSTON-SALEM POLICE CHIEF AFTER HIS TENURE AS SHERIFF. R. M. MCARTHUR WAS THE YOUNGEST SHERIFF TO SERVE FROM 1892-1896 AND WAS DECEASED AT 36. THE LAST EXECUTION BY HANGING IN FORSYTH COUNTY OCCURRED DURING HIS TENURE. THE FIRST PERSON TO HAVE A TELEPHONE IN HIS HOME, SPECIALLY INSTALLED FOR HIS DUTIES WAS EUGENE T. KAPP WHO SERVED FROM 1896-1902. FOLLOWING KAPP, F. P. ALSPAUGH WAS ELECTED TO SERVE FROM 1902-1906. ALSPAUGH AND KAPP CAMPAIGNED TOGETHER IN THE SAME WAGON. ALSPAUGH LATER BECAME A STATE LEGISLATOR. J. E. ZIGLAR SERVED FROM 1906-1910 AND WAS EASILY RECOGNIZED THROUGHOUT THE COUNTY BECAUSE OF A PRIZED WHITE STALLION, ON WHICH HE CAMPAIGNED AND WORKED. GEORGE W. FLYNT WON HIS FIRST ELECTION BY A MAJORITY OF 2 VOTES. HE SERVED AS SHERIFF FROM 1910-1922. J. B. MCCREARY SERVED FROM 1922-1930. HE WAS A WELL KNOWN STOCK DEALER AND NEVER LEARNED TO DRIVE AN AUTOMOBILE. TRANSOU SCOTT WAS SHERIFF 1930-1935. BEFORE HIS TENURE AS SHERIFF, HE SERVED WITH NC REVENUE DEPARTMENT. GUY L. SCOTT SERVED AS DEPUTY LESS THAN THREE YEARS BEFORE BEING APPOINTED IN 1935 TO SUCCEED HIS BROTHER. HE SERVED UNTIL 1936. ERNIE G. SHORE SERVED FROM 1936 TO 1970 AS SHERIFF. HE WAS A FORMER MAJOR LEAGUE BASEBALL PITCHER; HE REMAINED IN OFFICE LONGER THAN ANY OTHER FORSYTH COUNTY SHERIFF. MANLY LANCASTER WAS A PROGRESSIVE SHERIFF FROM 1970-1984. HE WAS A HIGHLY DECORATED WORLD WAR II GLIDER PILOT. PRESTON OLDHAM WAS APPOINTED SHERIFF IN 1984 AND ELECTED IN 1986 AND SERVED UNTIL 1990. HE WAS A DEDICATED OFFICER WHO WAS INSTRUMENTAL IN STARTING THE FIRST NARCOTICS DIVISION. RON BARKER WAS SHERIFF OF FORSYTH COUNTY FROM 1990 TO 2002. HE WAS A GRADUATE OF WAKE FOREST UNIVERSITY AND A FORMER TEACHER. HE SERVED 28 YEARS IN THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE, THE LAST 12 YEARS AS SHERIFF. THE CURRENT SHERIFF, WILLIAM T. SCHATZMAN, WAS ELECTED IN 2002. HE IS RETIRED FROM THE FBI AND WAS ASSIGNED TO FORSYTH COUNTY REGION AS A FIELD AGENT AND SUPERVISOR BEFORE HIS TENURE AS SHERIFF.











FORSYTH COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE PERCENTAGE OF GENERATIONAL WORKFORCE*

*GENERATIONS ACCORDING TO NC SCHOOL OF GOVERNMENT



NATIONAL SHERIFF'S OFFICE "CHAPLAIN OF THE YEAR"



DR. GLENN G. DAVIS HAS SERVED THE FORSYTH COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE WITH DISTINCTION SINCE JULY 23, 1988. WITH 29 YEARS EXPERIENCE IN CLINICALLY TRAINED HOSPITAL AND LAW ENFORCEMENT CRISIS COUNSELING, DR. DAVIS SUPPORTS EXISTING SHERIFF'S OFFICE STAFF, RETIREES, VOLUNTEERS, RELATIVES AND VICTIMS OF CRIME ACROSS FORSYTH COUNTY AND BEYOND. IN CONJUNCTION WITH HIS VARIED CRISIS COUNSELING RESPONSIBILITIES, DR. DAVIS HAS ALSO DEVELOPED MANY EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS DESIGNED TO PROMOTE BETTER UNDERSTANDING OF SURVIVOR-VICTIMS AND TO EQUIP THE RESPONDERS AND CAREGIVERS WHO ASSIST THEM. THESE PROGRAMS INCLUDE WORKSHOPS ON COMMUNITY CRISIS RESPONSE, DEATH NOTIFICATION AND TRAUMATIC GRIEF COUNSELING. DR. DAVIS HAS WORKED CLOSELY WITH THE WS/FC SCHOOLS, INTERNATIONAL CONFERENCE OF POLICE CHAPLAINS, N.C. VICTIM ASSISTANCE NETWORK, WAKE FOREST BAPTIST MEDICAL CENTER, CENTER FOR COMMUNITY SAFETY, HOSPITAL CHAPLAINS, HOSPICE, DISASTER RELIEF AGENCY PERSONNEL, AND LOCAL CHURCHES.

DR. DAVIS EARNED HIS BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE FROM COLLEGE OF CHARLESTON. HE EARNED HIS MASTERS OF DIVINITY FROM SOUTHEASTERN THEOLOGICAL SEMINARY AND HIS DOCTORATE IN PSYCHOLOGY FROM KENNEDY WESTERN UNIVERSITY.

THE OFFICE OF THE SHERIFF IS FORTUNATE TO HAVE A FULL-TIME CHAPLAIN TO ASSIST VICTIMS OF VIOLENT CRIME AND OTHER TRAUMA IN THE COMMUNITY. THE CHAPLAIN ALSO PROVIDES CONFIDENTIAL SUPPORT TO OFFICERS AND THEIR FAMILIES IN TIMES OF JOY AND SADNESS. THE CHAPLAIN'S WORK IS CHALLENGING AND HE OFTEN RESPONDS TO THE SCENE OF THE CRISIS, HOMES, WORKPLACES OR HOSPITALS, ON A 24-HOUR BASIS.

THE CURRENT PROGRAM ALSO TRAINS A CHAPLAIN RESPONSE TEAM, WHICH IS AN ECUMENICAL GROUP OF CLERGY VOLUNTEERS ON-CALL TO ASSIST STATE AND LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT BY PROVIDING PROFESSIONAL AND COMPETENT CARE TO BEREAVED FAMILIES IN THE AFTERMATH OF TRAGEDY.

SERVICES OFFERED BY THE CHAPLAIN INCLUDE:

- NOTIFYING AND PROVIDING CARE FOR FAMILIES IN THE EVENT OF SUDDEN DEATH DUE TO ACCIDENTS, SUICIDE OR HOMICIDE.
- PROVIDING COUNSELING AND REFERRALS FOR VICTIMS AND VICTIM'S FAMILIES.
- ASSISTING CITIZENS AND OFFICERS IN COPING WITH CRITICAL INCIDENTS.
- HOSPITAL VISITATION FOR OFFICERS AND IMMEDIATE FAMILY MEMBERS.
- SERVING AS LIAISON BETWEEN THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE AND THE RELIGIOUS COMMUNITY.
- CONDUCTING RELIGIOUS SERVICES SUCH AS FUNERALS AND WEDDINGS.
- TRAINING AND WORKSHOPS FOR PROFESSIONAL AND VOLUNTEER GROUPS.
- NETWORKING WITH THE SPECIAL OPERATIONS RESPONSE TEAM IN TIMES OF LOCAL AND REGIONAL DISASTERS AND CRITICAL INCIDENTS.
- ASSISTING OTHER ORGANIZATIONS AND LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES ON BEHALF OF THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE IN TIMES OF CRISIS AND TRAGEDY.

CAPTAIN PRITCHARD DIRECTLY SUPERVISES SIX (6) STAFF MEMBERS AND REPORTS DIRECTLY TO THE SHERIFF. HER RESPONSIBILITIES INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING AGENCY FUNCTIONS:

- INTERNAL AFFAIRS AND INVESTIGATIONS
- ACCREDITATION PROCESS
- RECORDS / PROCESS INTAKE
- PROPERTY AND EVIDENCE
- PISTOL PERMITS
- INSPECTIONS



THE PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS DIVISION (PSD) IS RESPONSIBLE FOR PROVIDING A MYRIAD OF CRITICAL SERVICES THAT SUPPORT THE MISSION AND OPERATIONS OF THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE. THE NITS OF THE PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS DIVISION PROVIDE A VARIETY OF SUPPORT SERVICES TO THE OTHER DIVISIONS OF THE AGENCY THAT INCLUDE INVESTIGATING INTERNAL AND CITIZEN-GENERATED COMPLAINTS OF ALLEGED MISCONDUCT AGAINST EMPLOYEES, PERFORMING POLICY REVIEW, INSPECTIONS OF UNIFORMED AND PROFESSIONAL STAFF MEMBERS ENSURING THEY ARE PROPERLY UNIFORMED, EQUIPPED, AND SUPPORTED IN THEIR DAILY DUTIES, SAFE AND SECURE STORAGE OF PROPERTY AND EVIDENCE, RECORDS MAINTENANCE, PROCESS INTAKE AND SERVICE. THE PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS DIVISION ALSO PROCESSES AND APPROVES THE ISSUANCE OF GUN PURCHASE PERMITS AND CONCEALED WEAPON PERMITS.

THE INTERNAL AFFAIRS UNIT IS RESPONSIBLE FOR CONDUCTING INVESTIGATIONS OF ALLEGED MISCONDUCT BY AGENCY CONSIDERS ITS RELATIONS WITH THE COMMUNITY TO BE OF PARAMOUNT IMPORTANCE AND ENCOURAGES CITIZENS TO EXPRESS THEIR OPINIONS REGARDING THE PERFORMANCE, PROFESSIONALISM, AND CONDUCT OF OUR EMPLOYEES.








PISTOL PERMITS AND PROCESS INTAKE



2005-2009




RECORDS

RECORDS IS THE CENTRAL PROCESSING AND HOUSING UNIT FOR ALL REPORTS THAT ARE GENERATED BY THIS AGENCY. THEY ALSO ENTER SOME CRIMINAL AND CIVIL PROCESSES AND SERVE SUBPOENAS BY PHONE. THEY ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR SUBMITTING MONTHLY VALIDATIONS REQUIRED BY THE DIVISION OF CRIMINAL INFORMATION WHICH MEANS EACH ENTRY (WANTED/MISSING PERSON, STOLEN VEHICLE, BOAT, SECURITY, LICENSE TAG AND GUN) MUST BE CHECKED TO ENSURE THE NATIONAL CRIME INFORMATION CENTER RECORDS ARE STILL VALID AND WILL REMAIN IN THE NATIONAL DATABASE. OUR PUBLIC WINDOW IS OPEN MONDAY - FRIDAY 8:30AM - 5:00PM FOR PUBLIC COPIES. RECORDS EMPLOYS 1 MANAGER, AND 6 FULL TIME CIVILIAN EMPLOYEES.



I AM VERY PLEASED WITH THE DEDICATED STAFF WHICH COMPRISES THE ENFORCEMENT BUREAU AND THEIR COMMITMENT TO SERVE THE CITIZENS OF FORSYTH COUNTY. OUR MEN AND WOMEN, BOTH PAID AND VOLUNTEER, DISPLAY EFFECTIVE AND COMPASSIONATE LAW ENFORCEMENT FUNCTIONS EACH DAY AS THEY PROVIDE SERVICE TO OUR COMMUNITY. CUTTING EDGE TECHNOLOGY HAS BEEN DEPLOYED TO FACILITATE OUR STAFF BEING BETTER ABLE TO COMBAT CRIME. OUR DECISIONS ARE BASED ON DATA WE HAVE GAINED AND ANALYZED IN AN EFFORT TO DEPLOY BEST PRACTICE MODELS. IN ADDITION, NEW CRIME PREVENTION PROGRAMS ARE BEING PROVIDED TO THE COMMUNITY IN AN EFFORT TO DETER CRIMINAL ACTIVITY.

DURING THE 2009 CALENDAR YEAR, THE OVERALL CRIME RATE DECREASED ONCE AGAIN WITHIN THE UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF FORSYTH COUNTY AND WITHIN THE SIX MUNICIPALITIES FOR WHOM WE PROVIDE PRIMARY LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES. THE EFFICIENCY OF THE SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS WAS INDICATED BY A REDUCTION IN THE VOLUME OF INCIDENTS AT OUR SCHOOLS. THESE REDUCTIONS IN CRIME AND SCHOOL INCIDENTS IS DIRECTLY ATTRIBUTED TO THE CRIME FIGHTING METHODOLOGY IN USE BY THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE STAFF AND HAS PROVEN SUCCESSFUL IN MAKING OUR COMMUNITY SAFER. WHILE WE EXPERIENCED AN INCREASE IN THE VOLUME OF CIVIL PROCESSES RECEIVED FOR SERVICE AND THE NUMBER OF FIREARM PERMIT APPLICATIONS, OUR STAFF MET THE CHALLENGE HEAD-ON AND INCREASED THE PERCENTAGE OF SERVED PROCESSES, AS WELL AS PROCESSING OF THE FIREARMS APPLICATIONS.

AS A FULL SERVICE LAW ENFORCEMENT PROVIDER, THE FORSYTH COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE STAFF TAKES PRIDE IN ITS ROLE AND RESPONSIBILITY IN THE DELIVERY OF QUALITY LAW ENFORCEMENT SERVICES. 






PATROL CALLS FOR SERVICE DENSITY 2009



COUNT OF CALLS FOR SERVICE TOBACCOVILLE BY HOUR OF DAY



PATROL CALLS FOR SERVICE DENSITY 2009




COUNT OF CALLS FOR SERVICE WALKERTOWN BY HOUR OF DAY







2009 PART I CRIME DENSITY MAP - FORSYTH COUNTY







TRAINING AND FLEET/PROCUREMENT

THE TRAINING SECTION PROVIDES AND COORDINATES TRAINING FOR ALL STAFF MEMBERS OF THE FORSYTH COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE. THE TRAINING PROVIDED IS TYPICALLY ACCREDITED THROUGH THE NORTH CAROLINA CRIMINAL JUSTICE EDUCATION AND TRAINING STANDARDS COMMISSION AND THE NORTH CAROLINA SHERIFF'S EDUCATION AND TRAINING COMMISSION OR A LOCAL COMMUNITY COLLEGE. THE SECTION ALSO DEVELOPS AND ADMINISTERS TRAINING THAT IS SPECIFIC TO NEEDS OF THE AGENCY.

THE FLEET AND PROCUREMENT UNIT OVERSEES THE PURCHASE AND OUTFITTING OF ALL SHERIFF'S OFFICE VEHICLES AND THE EQUIPMENT AND UNIFORM NEEDS OF ALL STAFF MEMBERS. THE SERGEANT ASSIGNED TO THIS UNIT ALSO PREPARES DETAILED REPORTS PERTAINING TO VEHICLE MILEAGE, AGENCY ACCIDENTS AND IS THE LIAISON FOR THE COUNTY ACCIDENT REVIEW COMMITTEE. THE UNIT CURRENTLY MAINTAINS ABOUT 255 VEHICLES.

THIS UNIT IS RESPONSIBLE FOR MAINTAINING AND MOBILIZATION OF THE AGENCIES SPECIALIZED EQUIPMENT SUCH AS THE MOBILE COMMAND UNIT, ALL TERRAIN VEHICLES, MARINE PATROL AND MOBILE SUPPORT VEHICLES THAT HOUSE EXTRA LIGHT SOURCES, GENERATORS AND SUPPLIES TO SUSTAIN DEPUTIES DURING EXTENDED OPERATIONS.







THE SHERIFF'S OFFICE ACTS AS A LIAISON BETWEEN THIS COUNTY AND OTHER LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES WHICH MAY REQUEST INFORMATION ON REGISTERED OFFENDERS. INFORMATION WILL ALSO BE PROVIDED TO THE GENERAL PUBLIC CONCERNING THE OFFENDERS AND THE APPLICABLE LAWS INVOLVING SEX OFFENDERS AS REQUESTED, IN COMPLIANCE WITH PUBLIC INFORMATION ONLY.




PRE-TRIAL RELEASE UPGRADED THE TRACKING SYSTEM IN 2009 TO A GPS SYSTEM TO ASSIST IN MONITORING INDIVIDUALS THAT HAVE BEEN RELEASED FROM CUSTODY. OUR DEPUTIES SERVE NUMEROUS COURTS, INCLUDING GRAND JURY, SUPERIOR COURT AND ONE COURT IN THE CITY OF KERNERSVILLE ON WEDNESDAYS. WE PROVIDE SAFETY AND SECURITY FOR JURORS AS WELL AS MAINTAINING ORDER FOR COURT OFFICIALS AND THE GENERAL PUBLIC ATTENDING COURT PROCEEDINGS. TRANSPORTATION'S PRIMARY RESPONSIBILITY IS TO TRANSPORT PRISONERS THROUGHOUT THE STATE FOR NEEDS SUCH AS SPECIALIZED MEDICAL TREATMENT OR MENTAL HEALTH EVALUATIONS AS DIRECTED BY THE COMMANDER, AS WELL AS TRANSPORTATION TO OTHER FACILITIES. 





THIS YEAR WE IMPLEMENTED PERMANENT SHIFTS FOR STAFF ASSIGNED TO DETENTION SECURITY TEAMS AND “BLACKBOARD”, AN ONLINE TRAINING DEVICE THROUGH FORSYTH TECHNICAL COMMUNITY COLLEGE, WHICH HAS DRASTICALLY DECREASED OVERTIME HOURS FOR DETENTION. WE HAVE FOUR SECURITY TEAMS AND SPECIAL RESPONSE TEAMS, WHICH ARE STAFFED BY SELECTED MEN AND WOMEN, WHO ARE TRAINED IN CONTROLLING AND RESOLVING EMERGENCY SITUATIONS. THIS DIVISION IS RESPONSIBLE FOR DETENTION TRAINING WHICH HAD 22,499 HOURS IN 134 COURSES. OFFICERS TRAINED IN CPR, GANG AWARENESS, JUVENILE SENSITIVITY, CELL EXTRACTION, HAZMAT, RIOT CONTROL, AND FIREARMS, JUST TO NAME A FEW. A FORMAL CLASSIFICATION SYSTEM IS UTILIZED FOR MANAGING AND SEPARATING INMATES ACCORDING TO THE NEEDS OF EACH INMATE AND SAFETY AND SECURITY OF THE FACILITY, STAFF AND OTHER INMATES. THE PROGRAM OFFERS 10 WEEKS OF ADVANCED INVESTIGATIVE, MANAGEMENT, AND FITNESS TRAINING FOR SELECTED OFFICERS HAVING PROVEN RECORDS AS PROFESSIONALS WITHIN THEIR AGENCIES. ON AVERAGE, THESE OFFICERS HAVE 19 YEARS OF LAW ENFORCEMENT EXPERIENCE AND USUALLY RETURN TO THEIR AGENCIES TO SERVE IN EXECUTIVE-LEVEL POSITIONS.

LEADERS AND MANAGERS OF STATE AND LOCAL POLICE, SHERIFFS' DEPARTMENTS, MILITARY POLICE ORGANIZATIONS, AND FEDERAL LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCIES ARE SELECTED TO PARTICIPATE IN THE 10 WEEK COURSE. PARTICIPATION IS BY INVITATION ONLY, THROUGH A NOMINATION PROCESS. PARTICIPANTS ARE DRAWN FROM EVERY STATE IN THE UNION, FROM U.S. TERRITORIES, AND FROM OVER 150 FOREIGN NATIONS. MORE THAN 41,000 GRADUATES NOW REPRESENT THE FBI NATIONAL ACADEMY SINCE IT BEGAN IN JULY, 1935.
