ORDINANCE ALLOWING THE SALE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IN THE UNINCORPORATED AREAS OF FORSYTH COUNTY BEGINNING AT 10:00 A.M. ON SUNDAY PURSUANT TO THE LICENSED PREMISES' PERMIT ISSUED UNDER N.C.G.S. 18B-1001 PURSUANT TO AUTHORITY IN N.C.G.S. 153A-145.7

WHEREAS, on June 29, 2017, the North Carolina General Assembly enacted Senate Bill 155, entitled "An Act to make Various Changes to the Alcoholic Beverage Control Commission Laws"; and

WHEREAS, Ratified Senate Bill 155 was signed into law and became effective on the 30th day of June, 2017 (Session Law 2017, Chapter 87); and

WHEREAS, Section 4 of Ratified Senate Bill 155 revised N.C.G.S. 153A-145.7 to authorize a county to adopt an ordinance allowing for the sale of malt beverages, unfortified wine, fortified wine, and mixed beverages beginning at 10:00 A.M. on Sunday pursuant to the licensed premises' permit issued under N.C.G.S. 18B-1001; and

WHEREAS, Sunday morning alcohol service will benefit the County's small business community, bring people into business districts earlier in the day, and generate increased tax revenues;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that the Forsyth County Board of Commissioners hereby allows the sale of malt beverages, unfortified wine, fortified wine, and mixed beverages in the unincorporated areas of Forsyth County beginning at 10:00 A.M. on Sunday pursuant to the licensed premises' permit issued under N.C.G.S. 18B-1001 pursuant to the authority contained in N.C.G.S. 153A-145.7.
