recommended that you hand deliver those by Monday, January 28th. You only need to submit one copy of the sealed transcript, but other documents require four copies. Mrs. April and Mrs. Kathy will make copies of the final emailed materials. The 4-H Honor Club is for those 4-H members age 16-21 that have excelled in their 4-H career. Only a small percentage of 4-H'ers are accepted. 4-H Scholarships are for entering college freshmen.

Youth Grantmakers in Action (YGA) of The Winston-Salem Foundation is a diverse group of young people from across Forsyth County that come together to gain leadership experience, represent teens in their community, voice their opinions and make grants to youth-directed projects that address community issues and challenges in Forsyth County. YGA is currently seeking grant applications that fulfill these basic requirements: project must have a positive impact on

youth in Forsyth County, be completed by July 15th, 2013; and planned and carried out by a group of youth, the majority of which should be between 13 and 18 years old. Each group must have an adult ally/advisor and a sponsoring organization. This sponsoring organization can be a community group or school. 2013 Essay Topic:
Reducing the Usage of
Bee-Killing Pesticides
in my Community

Pesticides are a fact of modern life, but misuse or overuse of pesticides, or making

poor choices when selecting and applying pesticides can be devastating to honey bees and other pollinators. The 4-H'ers are encouraged to learn about bee-killing pesticides being used in their communities – by homeowners, businesses, or farmers. Then, they should investigate how the impact of those pesticides on honey bees can be lessened.

The scope of the research is an

essential judging criterion, accounting for 40% of your score. The number of sources consulted, the authority of the sources, and the variety of the sources are all evaluated.

Personal interviews with beekeepers, farmers and others familiar with the subject are valued sources of information and should be documented. Sources, which are not cited in the endnotes, should be listed in a "Resources" or "Bibliography" list.

DISTRICT 4-H OFICERS

If you are interested in running for a district 4-H office, you must be nominated at our January 8th County Council meeting. You may run for President, Vice-President, Secretary/Treasurer or Reporter. You must be at least fourteen years old and have been an active 4-H'er for at least two years to be nominated. If elected, you must attend NC 4-H Congress, Teen Retreat, State Council Conference, the 4-H Lifetime Achievement awards in April, District Activity Day, as well as district council officer planning meetings.

4-H CLUB and INDIVIDUAL COMMUNITY SERVICE AWARDS

4-H clubs and individuals are encouraged to do a write-up on how they have implemented the State Project theme of "Revolution of Responsibility" this year. Entries are due January 25th. Last year there were ONLY TWO individual entries and three 4-H club entries in the entire STATE so start writing! There is no application for this award—please write (handwritten or typed) at least 3 pages explaining how you participated in the State 4-H Project this year. There is no formal application form to fill out. To enter, please put your awards, story, pictures, articles or supporting information together in a folder. On the outside of the folder specify if it is an Individual or a Club/Group

awards application. Applications will be awarded as Individual, Club/Group and County: Gold, Silver and Bronze Winners. State Winners will be the best of the Individual, best of the Club/Group, and best of the County applications.

In addition, clubs are encouraged to enter the 4-H Club Community

Service Award. They are also due January 25th and can be found at http://www.nc4h.org/uploads/documents/ publications/forms/2003commservrecord.pdf.

SCHOLARSHIP DOLLARS POLICY REMINDER

As a reminder, we offer 4-H "scholarship dollars" every time you participate in a competitive event. The dollars that you earn are put into a ledger and tracked so that you can pay for 4-H registration fees or be reimbursed for 4-H Project expenses. In order to be reimbursed, you must submit your original receipt within three months of the purchase. We request that you don't have any other purchases on your receipt. In addition, in order to receive funds, you must sell \$25 worth of plants for the annual 4-H Plant Sale held in March.
