What is the Relatives As Parents Program, RAPP?

Forsyth County's Department of Social Service's Relatives as Parents Program, or RAPP, provides support and activities to any relative or person providing full-time care-giving duties to another person's child, living full-time in their home, and whose parent(s) is absent. All RAPP activities are provided at low or no cost, and create ways for relative caregivers to meet others in their community. RAPP understands that caregivers face unique challenges in *unexpectedly* parenting someone else's child.

Why should I attend a group?

Because you are not alone! You may feel alone as a care giver, but you are not! Support gives you strength in finding others like yourself who have traveled this road. There are currently 7.8 million children in the US living with someone other than a parent. This information comes from Generations United, a NY group that supports kinship families like yours. (Note: No groups are held in July and August!)

Required Immunizations for Kindergarten Students and Rising 7th-Graders

New immunizations laws are affecting children entering kindergarten and seventh grade for the 2015-16 school year. Children starting kindergarten or seventh grade this fall are required by North Carolina to have specific vaccines to protect them from serious diseases.

Kindergartners are required to have:

- two doses of varicella (chicken pox) vaccine if they do not have a history of disease documented by a health care provider;
- the fourth dose of polio vaccine must be given after 4 years of age and before entering school for the first time;
- a physical exam signed by their physician.

Children who start seventh grade this fall are required to have vaccines as recommended by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). Students are required to have:

- one dose of Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis);
- one dose of meningococcal vaccines if they have not previously received these vaccines.

State law requires the school system to suspend students who haven't received the vaccination after 30 days into the school year.

The health department (799 Highland Avenue, Winston-Salem, NC, 27101) offers the vaccination at its walk-in clinics at the following times:

- Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, 8:30 a.m.-3:45 p.m.
- Thursday, 9:30 a.m.-6:45 p.m.
- Friday, 8:30 a.m.-11:45 a.m.

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September Support Group Programs

Our September support groups will both be led by Tonja Fultz, Employment Specialist at Project Re-Entry. Project Re-Entry, housed at GoodWill Industries, helps people who are coming out of prison, providing tools to help with finding employment, and with adjusting to life in general.

If you know someone who is re-entering the community after spending time in jail, Ms. Fultz can help provide information and resources. Project Re-Entry has a high success rate in helping people secure employment.

Re-establish Your School Day Routines!

- 1. Pack the book bag and put it at the door the night before.
- 2. Pick out clothes the night before; be ready to jump in them!
- 3. Have an assigned "office" area used for studying and work.
- 4. Keep needed supplies in the "office" and the back pack:
 - Stapler, ruler, scissors, glue sticks, tape, pens/pencils
- 5. Keep the office organized; if items are used, make sure the child puts them back where they belong.
- 6. Finish ALL homework before games, internet, texting, TV, etc.

Finally, be sure to <u>mark your calendars</u> as there is no school on Labor Day, September 7, and there are two early release days, 9/16 and 9/30.
