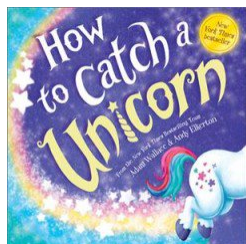

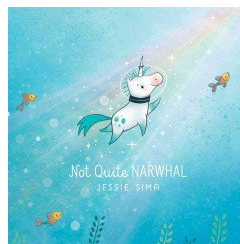


Summer Reads for Preschool and Kindergarten



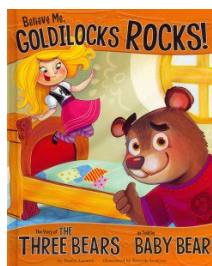
How to Catch a Unicorn by Adam Wallace

Not Quite Narwhal by Jessie Sima

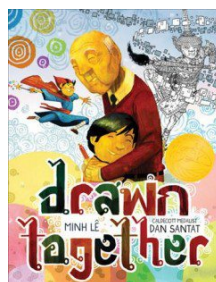
Born under the sea to a family of narwhals, a little unicorn begins questioning his differences when a current sweeps him to the ocean's surface, where he discovers other creatures like himself.



Believe Me, Goldilocks Rocks!

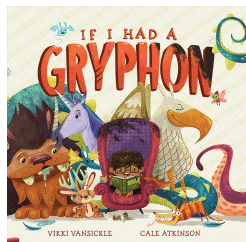

Baby Bear, who wants to be called Sam, tells the true story of what happened when he and his parents went for a walk while their porridge cooled.



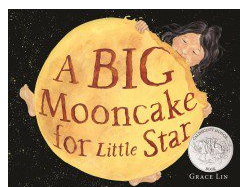
Drawn Together by Minh Lê

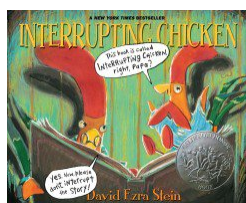
If I Had a Gryphon by Vikki VanSickle

A Big Mooncake for Little Star by Grace Lin

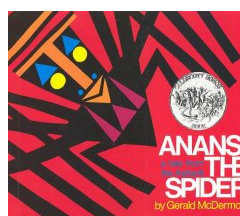
Reimagines the cycles of the moon as a mother bakes a Big Moon Cookie and, despite Mama's request to wait, Little Star begins nibbling at it every night.
